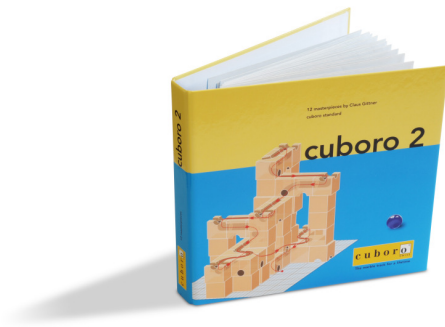
Book «cuboro 2» - masterpieces of marble tracks

The building plans can be removed and have a size of 40 x 63 centimetres. The tracks in the book are arranged from the 54 cubes of the basic set «cuboro standard».
